NZ Age Group Nominations

COACHES & MANAGERS

2024 World University, U21, U19 coach nominations are OPEN and close 26 October

2024 World University & U21 managers nominations are **OPEN** and close 26 October

2024 U18 North vs South coach and manager nominations open 14 November

• ATHLETES

2024 U23, World University, U21 & U19 athlete nominations are **OPEN** and close 19 November

5km erg tests for NZ based U23, World University & U21 nominees must also be submitted within this period. U19 nominees can submit either a 5km or a 30 min@20 test.

Athletes must indicate if they wish to be considered and are available for the development camps when they submit their nomination.

Athlete nominations for U18 North & South teams will open on 1 January 2024 and will close on 25 February 2024. A 2km test will need to be completed and submitted within this period.

Age Group Development Camps

ROWING >>>> NEW ZEALAND

Athletes must indicate if they wish to be considered and are available for the camp when they submit their nomination.

The dates of the Development Camps for selected athletes are as follows:

- U23 Development Camp (US and NZ athletes): 19-23 December 2023 Lake Karāpiro
- U21 South Island Development Camp: 6-8 December 2023 Lake Ruataniwha
- U21 North Island Development Camp: 13-15 December 2023 Lake Karāpiro
- U19 South Island Development Camp: 10-12 December 2023 Lake Ruataniwha
- U19 North Island Development Camp: 17-19 December 2023 Lake Karāpiro

Selections for all age group development camps will be announced by 24 November.


International Students

Please be aware of your School Team Eligibility Criteria limits (STEC) if you have any international exchange students participating in rowing this season.

International exchange students are quite likely to be considered "new" and count towards the STEC limits if they have rowed before at another school or club but their circumstances need to be checked carefully.

NZSSRA Subs

The invoices have been issued for the 2023-24 NZSSRA subs.

By becoming members of the NZSSRA, your school will be able to enter the NZSSRA regattas for the 2023-24 season. These regattas are the:

- North and South Island Secondary Schools Rowing Championships (NISS & SISS)
- NZ Secondary Schools Rowing Championships (Aon Maadi Regatta)

The portal to enter crews in these regattas will not open for your school unless you are a financial member so we urge payment be made before the end of 2023. Please do not leave it to the last minute.

Check, Clean, Dry - Freshwater Gold Clams

The Check, Clean, Dry process is extremely important for all clubs and schools coming to Lake Karāpiro this season. The Freshwater Gold Clam was found along the Waikato River in May 2023. Overseas, this clam has proved difficult to control and eradication has never been achieved.

These clams reproduce rapidly (able to produce 400 juveniles a day and up to 70,000 juveniles a year) and form large populations that can clog water-based infrastructure such as electricity generation plants, irrigation systems, and water treatment plants. More information can be found HERE.

Just a reminder:

- ordinary detergent doesn't work
- bleach, heat or freezing is the only way to clean your absorbent materials
- blast your boats and oars with your hose (you may need to purchase a nozzle or gun attachment)
