New Safety Craft

South Island Rowing (SIRI) launched a new state of the art 1300cc Safety / Rescue Jet Ski at the weekend. The dedicated craft is provided through the support of the Lion Foundation and Southern Victorian Charitable Trust. The craft is capable of carrying three people and will be utilised at all regattas conducted under the auspices of SIRI and the Wings Over Water event.



On Saturday 4th October Lake Ruataniwha was the venue for the Concept 2, R2 K regatta. The event was the brainchild of local Twizel rowing stalwart Fred Strachan and from small beginnings, its popularity seems to grow each year.

Fred saw the need for young athletes that have trained over the winter months to have a competitive race 'blow out' regatta to start the season and access where the athletes were at fitness wise after the cold winter months of training. 107 scullers participated with the chance to win a set of Concept Sculling blades up for winning in the various age group races.

The conditions certainly tested both the athletes and the new safety jet. Which when required proved an asset in pulling those that capsized from the cold waters of Lake Ruataniwha. The sport of rowing is extremely grateful to the trusts for their financial assistance in providing such an essential new craft especially for the youth.

Wharf

The wharf at the start is on poor condition. We have reports of a number of near misses with people tripping up on the uneven surface. We have known for some time that we need to do something but it seems the time is upon us. When the wing got up on the first day of racing, the waves were braking over the deck. We also noted that the deck was lifting and this seems to mean that the attachment to the top of the piles is not good either.



There are a number of possible solutions and one is to place concrete planks within the confines of the piles, fill the space with gravel and pour a concrete deck. Unfortunately, this is likely to result in a serious wave build up from the reflection of the incident waves. If some one has a easy and relatively cheap solution, please let us know.
